
















Pentagon 2010's -

# Regional Councils in Finland

- The regional level is anchored by the Regional Councils, which are joint municipal authorities acting as the main planning and coordination bodies for regional development.
- The councils are responsible for drafting regional development plans, which outline strategic priorities based on the region's specific needs and potential.
- The Regional Councils ensure that local initiatives are in harmony with national development goals and serve as a platform for collaboration among municipalities, facilitating the pooling of resources and knowledge for regional projects.
- Regional Councils coordinate regional development efforts and can access EU funds and national grants to support projects that stimulate economic growth and improve infrastructure.
- The councils are governed by a Regional Assembly, which is an elected body comprising representatives from the member municipalities. These representatives are elected based on local elections, ensuring that the composition of the Regional Assembly reflects the political will of the region's inhabitants.
