








- Launch of negotiations 22 May 2023

- The programme organises 10 business missions to Japan and 10 to the Republic of Korea over the next four years.
- Each business mission will allow a group of 50 cuttingedge companies to benefit from extensive business coaching throughout their participation



SME SUPPORT

Provide tailored assistance to selected EU companies, especially SMEs, in establishing business connections in Japan and the RoK.

PROMOTION OF THE EU BRAND

Promote the visibility and presence of EU businessesand the **EU brand and standards** in Japan and RoK.

ENHANCED MARKET INSIGHT



WHO CAN PARTICIPATE



EU SMEs and startups



Exist for five (5)* years and be able to demonstrate three (3) years of financial figures. * For Start-Ups only: exist for three (3) years and be able to demonstrate two (2) years of financial figures.



Be active and operational in one of the economic sectors covered by the programme, either as a producer, a sub-contractor or as an R&D or engineering company-business consultants are not eligible.



Have a sufficient turnover and number of people employed to successfully enter the target market.



Be entirely or majority EU-owned and have the headquarters in the European Union.



Have a proven track record of international business cooperation (outside the EU).



Have a solid business strategy for entering the Japanese and Republic of Korea markets.

SMEs and startups can participate in up to 3 business missions distributed between both target countries, with the opportunity to engage in a maximum of two missions in the same country.










ELIGIBILITY DECISION

- If your company profile is not eligible for the specific business missions, do not hesitate to reach out for feedback. Your company may be eligible for another Business Mission.
- Please note that the Expression of Interest form is not the finalised application.
- Eligible companies will be invited to fill in an Application form to the business mission they would like to participate in.





European Partnership on Innovative SMEs/Eurostars: joint transnational call for proposals (CALL 8 of Eurostars-3)

- The call focuses on **funding international collaborative R&D and innovation projects** involving innovative SMEs, universities, research organisations, and large companies
- The key goals of the project are:
 - Facilitate international collaboration to develop innovative, marketable products, services, and processes.
 - Encourage participation of SMEs to enhance global competitiveness.
- To be eligible, projects must meet the following criteria:
 - The consortium must be led by an **innovative SME** from a Eurostars country.
 - The consortium must consist of at least two independent entities from at least **two Eurostars countries**, including one from an EU or Horizon Europe Associated Country.
 - The focus must be on civil applications.

Support for simple programmes targeting China (including Hong-Kong and Macao), Japan, South Korea, Taiwan, South-eastern Asia or Southern Asia

- The purpose of this call is to **increase the awareness and recognition** of the Union's of EU agricultural products quality and restore **market confidence** in cases of market disturbances or consumer trust issues.
- This call includes various thematic focuses, each targeting different objectives:
 - **Union quality schemes:** Promote EU quality schemes (PDO, PGI, TSG) and quality logos for products from EU outermost regions and increase recognition of these schemes among consumers and enhance market opportunities.
 - **Organic production:** Highlight the benefits of organic production methods, including sustainability and environmental impact.
 - **Sustainability and animal welfare**: Emphasise the role of sustainable agriculture in climate, environmental protection, and animal welfare and raise awareness of sustainable practices and their benefits.
 - Targeted third countries: Promote EU agri-food products in specific non-EU markets
 - Organic or sustainable agriculture in third countries: Promote organic production methods or sustainable agricultural practices in third countries, enhancing recognition and competitiveness.
- The expected impact is to **enhance the competitiveness and consumption of EU agri-food products** and/or to increase awareness of the EU quality schemes, raise their profile and increase their market share in the targeted countries

Scale-up and optimisation of manufacturing processes for electrolyser materials, cells, or stacks

- This call aims to use **optimisation and upscaling of manufacturing processes** is required to increase production yields and improve cost-effectiveness. New materials, components, and stack designs for improved efficiencies and reduced environmental impact must be produced in sufficient quantities to meet the growing needs of **clean hydrogen production** facilities.
- Projects are expected to:
 - Enhance European competitiveness in electrolyser production by increasing production rates and reducing costs.
 - Improve production yields (>98%) and material efficiency (>80%).
 - Contribute to reduced CAPEX for water electrolysis systems and support affordable clean hydrogen production.
 - Create **high-value manufacturing jobs** in the supply chain.

Joint EUROCLUSTERS for Europe's recovery
