EU-SOUTH MED MATCHMAKING EVENT

Background

The European Commission (EC), through the European Cluster Collaboration Platform (ECCP), will host the EU-South MED Matchmaking Event in Cairo, Egypt, from 16 to 18 June 2025. This event will be organised in collaboration with the Euromed Cluster Forward initiative funded by DG MENA, the Federation of Egyptian Industries, and Enterprise Europe Network (EEN). It will take place in the framework of two major international exhibitions: Egypt Infrastructure & Water Expo and Big 5 Construct Egypt.

The EU – South MED Matchmaking Event will bring together cluster organisations and SMEs from the European Union (EU), non-EU countries participating in the Single Market Programme/COSME Strand, and South MED countries: Egypt, Morocco, Algeria, Jordan, Lebanon, Palestine and Tunisia. It will provide participants an excellent chance to promote Cluster to Cluster (C2C), Cluster to Business (C2B), and Business to Business (B2B) collaborations.

Practical Information – Egypt

Transfer from / to the Airport

- Cairo International Airport (CAI) is located approximately 15 to 25 kilometers from central Cairo, and around 20 kilometres to the main Hotel venue with a transfer time ranging between 30 and 60 minutes depending on traffic conditions.
- Taxi fare from the airport to central areas (e.g., Nasr City, Downtown, or New Cairo) generally costs around EGP 150–300 (approximately €3.5–7) depending on the distance and time of travel. Night-time or heavy traffic hours may increase the cost.
- Tourists are often targeted by free taxi drivers in the arrival hall. The old black and white taxis usually do not have a meter, and prices are negotiated before travelling. The white taxis have meters. The price list for a category C limousine should give an idea of the upper limit for acceptable fares. The fare is metered and most of these are new and air-conditioned.
- <u>City Busses</u> (all Cairo directions) and busses for destinations for all other Governorates
 (West Delta, Upper Egypt, East Delta, and Super Jet) most are air-conditioned.
 Departures are from the Bus Station located in the parking area in front Terminal 1 only.
- It is recommended to avoid accepting rides from drivers directly at the terminal exits.
 Instead, look for the official taxi rank or use a ride-hailing app like Uber or Careem for fixed pricing and safety.

CURRENCY AND PAYMENT

The official currency in Egypt is the Egyptian pound (EGP), which is often written as LE or E£. One Egyptian pound is further divided into 100 piastres. The Central Bank of Egypt issues various notes in different denominations.

LANGUAGE

You will be able to speak English and German. The official language of Egypt is Arabic, specifically Modern Standard Arabic for formal communication. Most Egyptians speak one of several local Arabic dialects, which can vary significantly from the formal written language. Besides Arabic, English and French are widely understood, especially in business, education, and tourist areas. English is the most common international language spoken, particularly among younger generations and professionals.

TIPPING

Plan to tip around 10-15% in Egyptian restaurants. However, the exact tip amount when eating out in Egypt depends on the place, occasion, and order size. It's customary to give your waiter or waitress a slightly higher tip than you would a bartender, as they are likely sharing their tip with the kitchen staff.
